LICENSURE AREAS

All middle and high school areas, including CTE. K-12 licensure in English as a Second Language, Fine/Performing Arts, World Languages, and Physical Education.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Local Alternative Teacher Preparation Program (LATP) is a low cost accelerated teacher licensure program facilitated by the CCRESA. The LATP program offers recent college graduates and mid-career professionals who hold Bachelor degrees in non-teaching areas the opportunity to become fully licensed teachers.

LATP is available to lateral entry teachers who work in participating Central North Carolina school districts. Participants complete all program requirements while teaching full-time in their districts. Participants are active cohort members learning and growing together with beginning teachers from across multiple school districts.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Low Cost: Program cost is shared between the participant and the school district, and is a fraction of the cost of college tuition.

Licensure: Upon successful completion of the 2-year program and required testing, participants become fully licensed teachers for the state of North Carolina.

Coaching & Mentoring: Participants are provided with a district coach and mentor to help them through the first two years as a beginning teacher.

Coursework: Courses will take place in a blended format across the region and can be completed in 18 months.

Competency Based Assessment: Participants do not receive letter grades, but are evaluated on demonstration of teaching competencies.

LATP CLASS REQUIREMENTS

COACH & MENTOR SUPPORT

YEAR 1

- 80 hour lateral entry district orientation
- Summer Saturday Program Kickoff
- 16 evening classes, semimonthly
- 1 day Spring Symposium

- 36 hours of district coaching support
- 36 hours of district mentor support
- 12 hours of other beginning teacher support

YEAR 2

- 3 week LATP Summer Institute
- 25 hours of Independent Study
- 1 day Spring Symposium

- 24 hours of district coaching support
- 18 hours of district mentor support
- 12 hours of other beginning teacher support

Participants must pass the required Praxis 2 and/or Pearson testing

COMPENTENCY BASED ASSESSMENT

LATP Competencies are based upon the North Carolina Professional Teaching Standards. Evidence of proficiency in each competency is required through demonstration of teaching skills and classroom techniques that maximize student learning.
